**UNIVERSITY OF PITTSBURGH HEALTH CAREER SCHOLARS ACADEMY**

**PENNSYLVANIA SCHOOL FOR GLOBAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP (LEHIGH UNIVERSITY—BETHLEHEM, PA)**

**Student Eligibility:**

The applicant must be a current sophomore or junior (age 16-18) in secondary school. The applicant who accepts an invitation to attend the program must commit to being in residence for the full 35-day program which does not allow trips home or other absences. ### GEORGETOWN UNIVERSITY PRE-COLLEGE SUMMER PROGRAMS
